

ABOUT KARNATAK UNIVERSITY :

It had its official inauguration in March 1950. It was established to cater to the needs for higher education of people of North Karnataka. DEPARTMENT OF DR. B.R. AMBEDKAR STUDIES - A PROFILE:

The Department of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Studies was established in the year 1988. Karnatak University holds the credit of being the pioneering institution of higher education to start the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Chair in the Department of Political Science headed by late Prof. A.M. Rajashekhariah, who obtained his Ph.D on Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. He was instrumental in establishing the Ambedkar Chair with the help of UGC grants, first of its kind in the entire country.

Department of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Studies offers Post-Graduate Diploma in Ambedkar and Open Elective Courses which help the students to understand the life and philosophy of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. Every year around 800 students study Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's Thoughts. The department had organized Dr. B.R. Ambedkar memorial lectures by inviting eminent jurists like Justice P.B. Gajendragadkar the then, Chief Justice of Maharashtra, Justice A. Varadaraja, Justice A.R. Krishna Iyer, Justice O. Chinnappa Reddy and Justice M. Rama Jois who had delivered special lectures on Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's Thoughts and Contribution to society. The department offers courses in Dr. Ambedkar's life and mission, social, economic, religious philosophy and political thoughts of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. The department has been instrumental in organizing conferences, seminars workshops, special talks on various aspects of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar's contribution to the world at large and oppressed sections of society in particular. On 4th, 5th and 6th October 2016, on occasion of the celebration of 125th birth anniversary of Dr. B R Ambedkar, the first ever International Conference was organised by the department in collaboration with Sera Jey Monastic University, Bylukuppe on Creating Better World: Dr. B R Ambedkar's Vision and Perspectives. A record number of participants from India and abroad actively participated in this conference and over 1000 papers on various sub themes were presented by scholars and students. DEPARTMENT OF ANTHROPOLOGY



The department was established in the year 1959. This is one of the oldest departments in South India, and the first in the Karnataka State offering Post-Graduate Education leading to Masters and Doctoral degrees in Anthropology. It continues to provide courses in Higher Education and Research in the field of Anthropology since its inception.

It began as Department of Social Anthropology offering Masters Degree in Social Anthropology. In 1962, the department was entrusted with the responsibility of running a P. G. Course in Social work also. This arrangement existed till 1971. In 1973 the Department was renamed as the Department of Anthropology. In the same year in addition to the existing Social Cultural Anthropology Specialization, full pledged Specialization in Physical and Biological Anthropology were introduced with the establishment of Physical / Biological Anthropological laboratories. During 1990s the Department was entrusted with the responsibility of starting and running a multi-disciplinary Post-Graduate Diploma Course in Women's Studies. The Department shouldered this responsibility for about a decade.

Vision:

To develop the Department of Studies in Anthropology as a major centre of research and consultancy on various aspects of social, cultural, biological and medical dimensions of human existence.

Mission

To prepare young Anthropologists capable of bringing awareness to the society at large on biological / cultural variations in human beings to develop mutual tolerance and peaceful coexistence. To build capacities to conduct research in this direction at micro and macro levels in order to use these insights for developmental programmes.

About DHARWAD CITY

Dharwad is the district headquarters and the cultural capital of north Karnataka. The town is built on seven hills and lakes. It is also called as Chota Mahabaleshwar. Dharwad in the fringe of Malenadu is a centre for higher education with several universities, including the recent addition of IIT and IIIT. It is known for its great traditions in music and literature. The twin cities Dharwad and Hubballi occupy an important place in the state. Dharwad is 425 KMS northwest of Bangalore on NH 4 between Bangalore and Pune. It is well connected with Bus, Train and Air facilities. The nearest airports are : Hubballi Airport (22kms), Belagavi Sambra Airport (80kms), Goa Panjim Airport (160 kms) Dharwad has a history of over one millennium.

All the dynasties of North Karnataka ruled the region until 1818 when the British began their rule after overthrowing the Peshwas of Pune. The British Dharwad was a humble town. The town has fort built by the Vijavangar empire in 1403. Dharwad palyed a siginificant role in India's struggle for Independence. Great leaders like Tilak (1907) Gandhiji and Lala Lajpat Rai (both in 1921) Rajaji (1927) Bose (1938). Savarkar (1940) have paid their visit to this town. Progressive King of Kolhapur, Shahu Maharaja, was educated at Maratha Mandal School in Dharwad.

Great humanist, Epoch maker Dr. B.R. Ambedkar and his wife Smt. Ramabai Ambedkar visited this place and stayed here at Buddha Rakkhit School at Dharwad. The Dharwadians celebrated at the circle now known as Jubilee Circle in 1947 when India got its Independence. Hence the city of Dharwad is going to lay a milestone in organizing this National Seminar under the auspicious of Karnatak University, Dharwad.

DR. B.R. AMBEDKAR & DHARWAD

A UNIQUE RELATIONSHIP

In 1856 a Mahar (oppressed class) boy sought admission to pursue his education in Dharwad. Then the East India Company was ruling India. Because of the social restrictions imposed by Hindus on Depressed Classes, it could not take decision in the favour of Mahar boy. Therefore, the company referred the case to the then Queen of England. When Babasaheb Ambedkar was pursuing higher education in U.K. (1920), in the India Office Library he came across records of plea of Mahar boy. Babasaheb Ambedkar was thrilled to see the letter of the boy. In this connection Babasaheb Ambedkar wanted to visit Dharwad. In 1929 he started a Boarding for untouchable boys. In the year 1930-31 when Babasaheb Ambedkar went to England to participate in the Round Table Conference, Matoshri Ramabai came to Dharwad and stayed with the inmates of the boarding and in the time of distress she had to pawn her gold bangles to provide ration for the poor inmates. Sir Siddappa Kambli the then Minister for Education who hailed from Dharwad was very close to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. In the year 1925-26 Bombay Government appointed a University Reform Committee. Sir Chimanal Setlavad was appointed as a Chairman. Though Ambedkar was not a member of the Committee, the Committee sent a questionnaire to him. Babasaheb Dr. B. R. Ambedkar gave a written report to the committee in which he recommended to consider Dharwad as a potential centre for higher education & to start a University.

CLIMATE AND PLACES OF TOURISTS INTEREST :

Dharwad has moderate climate in January. The nearby tourist places are Dandeli, Goa, Kittur Fort, Savadatti, Gotagodi, Badami, Aihole, Pattadakallu, Hampi, Bijapur, Buddha Vihar at Sannati and Gulbarga.
