

About Level I Accreditation

Technician restricted profile anthropometrist

Level 1 is designed for the majority of ISAK-accredited anthropometrists who have little on-going requirement for more than the measurement of base measurements and skinfolds. A small number of girths and three bone breadths have also been included at this level to enable the monitoring of health and growth variables, and calculation of the somatotype and body composition - all of which ISAK sees as valuable tools for the comparison of body size, shape and composition. Thus, a person who successfully completes Level 1 can demonstrate adequate precision in 4 base measures, 8 skinfolds, 6 girths and 3 breadths and has a basic understanding of the theory of anthropometric applications.

Resource Person

Dr. Anup Adhikari has a Ph.D. in Physiology. He is a L4 Anthropometrist (ISAK). He is also a Certified First Aid Instructor with Canadian Red Cross. He is working as a Personal Trainer (Can-Fit-Pro), Nutrition and Wellness Specialist (Can-Fit-Pro).

Uses

ISAK certification is mandatory to get job in Sports Anthropometry. It gives extra advantage to get job in colleges and Universities, Sports education, Physical Anthropology, an Physiology, Nutrition, Training program, Physical Education, Dietician. It is mandatory to get job in Sports Authority of India (SAI) to get job in Anthropometrist.

Eligible Candidates

All Post Graduate Students and PhD Research Scholars are eligible for the Course. The Total Capacity is only 15 Students. The Participants are selected on first come first serve basis.

Course Fee

Course Fee for each participant is Five Thousand Five Hundred Rupees only (INR 5500/-) which includes ISAK fees \$60 dollars + services.

A working lunch to all participants will be provided for all three days.

About University and College

Karnatak University is the second oldest university in Karnataka state and one of the reputed institutions for higher education in the country. It started functioning from April 1949 with Mr. R.A.Jahagirdar as the first Vice-Chancellor. It was Late Dr. D.C.Pavate who visualized the role of this university and strove to make this, one of the best in the country giving it national and international recognition. The university is re-accredited with 'A' Grade in the year 2022 by NAAC.

The Karnatak State University Act – 2001 governs the University. The Jurisdiction of the university is extended over Dharwad, Gadag, Haveri and Uttar Kannada districts. The university campus named as "Pavate Nagar" has 48 post graduate departments, more than 280 affiliated colleges, a P.G. department of Marine Biology at Karwar, P.G.centers at Haveri and Gadag, NIC network (RENIC), center for excellence in polymer Science and many more.

The idea of starting a college in North Karnataka was floated as early as 1876. The real beginning of the endeavors however was not made till the year 1909. The Karnatak College Association was formed with Late Shri.R.B.Rodda as Chairman. Later due to efforts of Late Shri.Diwan Bahadur Srinivas Rao Rodda, Late Shri.Rao Bahadur Rudragouda Artal and Late Shri.M.B.Choubal, the foundation stone of Karnatak College was laid on 20th June 1917 by the then Governor of Bombay (earstwhile Bombay Province). Karnatak College was established with an intention of providing something more than a machine for grinding our graduates and a place where the young men and women will learn to be athletes, self reliant and loyal citizens of country. Late Sir. Siddappa Kambli played a vital role in establishing the science wing in Karnatak College in 1924.

After the establishment of Karnatak University at Dharwad, in 1958, it took over the Karnatak College to run it as a Model College. Later, the Karnatak College was bifurcated into two sister colleges as "Karnatak Science College" & "Karnatak Arts College" sharing a common campus and other campus amenities for administrative purpose.

About Department of Studies in Anthropology, KUD

The department was established in the year 1959, eminent anthropologist Dr. K. Ishwaran founded the Department, This is one of the oldest departments in South India, and the first in the Karnataka State offering Post-Graduate Education leading to Master's and Doctoral degrees in Anthropology. It continues to provide courses in Higher Education and Research in the field of Anthropology since its inception.

The Department finds special mention in the Handbook of Indian Universities, 1964 for its excellent work.

About Department of Anthropology, KACD

The subject of Anthropology has been introduced as a major/minor in 1960. In 1962, the department of social Anthropology was separated from the composite department of History and Economics. Then Dr. L. S. Ainapur was heading the Department. Prof. A. G. Hiremath was appointed in 1961.

The name of the department was changed from 'the department of social anthropology' to 'The Department of Anthropology' in 1971. The teaching of anthropology was extended to science classes as one of the minor subjects in 1975. Since 1990-91, Anthropology is being taught as one of optional for both B.A. and B.Sc. courses.

About ISAK

The International Society for the Advancement of Kinanthropometry (ISAK) was founded as an organization of individuals whose scientific and professional endeavour is related to kinanthropometry. ISAK's purpose is to create and maintain an international network of colleagues who represent the world community transcending geography, politics and the bounds of separate disciplines in order to establish a dynamic area of scientific endeavour.

Kinanthropometry is the area of science concerned with the measurement of human body composition. As a result of changes in life styles, nutrition, activity levels and ethnic composition of populations, changes to the distribution of body dimensions are forever occurring. Kinanthropometry is the interface between anatomy and movement. It takes the measurement of the human body and determines its capability for function and movement in a range of settings.

ISAK has developed international standards for anthropometric assessment and an international anthropometry accreditation scheme (IAAS). The accreditation scheme is based on the concept of a four-level hierarchy. A key element in it is the objective maintenance of quality assurance by requiring that all levels have to meet initial technical error of measurement (TEM).

ISAK has trained more than 45,000 anthropometrists. There are associate members from 86 different countries. Membership to the Society is currently included in accreditation fees. All accreditation courses in kinanthropometry by the ISAK level 1, 2 and 3 are carried out with the highest quality standards.
