The Ordinance 99 reads as under:

### ORDINANCE 99:

**0.99** (a) No. candidate shall be eligible for an award of Gold Medal/ Prize/Scholarship, if he joins a course of studies to which the award relates, after a lapse of two academic years from the earlier qualifying examination.

The condition mentioned in Clause 99 (a) will not apply to the following courses :

**0.99** (b) No candidate shall be eligible for award of Gold Medal/ Prize/scholarship unless the candidate passes the course in the minimum prescribed period and at first attempt.

**0.99** (c) No candidate shall be eligible for the award of Gold Medal, Prize or Scholarship unless the candidate passes the concerned examination in the first attempt and scored 60% of marks at the Examination as a whole if the award is on the basis of the examination as a whole or 60% in the concerned paper/subject if the award relates to the paper or the subject. **Statute:** Determination of the age of Karnatak University employees.

**1. Short Title:-** This Statute may be called the Determination of the age of Karnatak University employees.

**2. Definition:-** In this statute, 'University employees' means a person who is in the service of the Karnatak University.

### **3. Determination Of Age Of Entry Into University Services:-**

1) Every person on appointment as a University employee shall declare his age along with the date of birth, and in support of such declaration shall furnish to the appointing authority documentary evidence, namely, an authenticated extract from the birth of baptismal register, original horoscope or correspondence contemporaneous with the time of birth indicating the date and time of birth, an authenticated copy or extract from the entries made in school or college records indicating the date of birth.

Provided that where any such document is not available the reasons for its non-availability shall be furnished along with the such other documentary evidence in support of the declaration of the age and date of birth as the appointing authority may require.

2) The appointing authority (or a Committee constituted by the appointing authority) shall after considering the evidence produced by the university employee and after such enquiry as it deems fit, accept the age and date of birth which in its opinion is

satisfactorily established, and shall inform the University employee and shall record or cause to be recorded in the service register or book or any other record of service of the University employee the age and date of birth so accepted.

Provided that if the age and date of birth of a University employee has been determined by a decree of a civil court obtained by the University employees, the age and date of birth so determined shall be accepted and recorded or caused to be recorded in the service Register or book or any other record of Service of the University employee concerned.

Provided further that in case of University employee who has passed the Secondary School Leaving Certificate Examination or any other examination equivalent there to, the date of birth and age specified in the certificate, evidencing pass in such examination shall be accepted as his date of birth and age.

3) Notwithstanding anything contained in (sub-para(1)) and 2) the age and date of birth of a University employee accepted and recorded in his service register or book or any other record of service before the date of commencement of this statute shall be deemed to be the age and date of birth of such University employee accepted and recorded in the service register or book or any other record of service under sub-para (2).

4) The age and date of birth accepted and recorded or determined to have been accepted and recorded in the service register or book or any other record of service under sub-para(2) as the case may be under sub-para(3) shall subject to any alteration made under para(4) be applicable for all purposes relating to the conditions of service including superannuation and retirement of the University employee concerned.



#### 4. Alteration of age or date of birth of University employees:

1) Subject to sub- para (2) the University may, at any time, after an inquiry alter the age and date of birth of a University employee as recorded or deemed to have been recorded his service register or book or any other record of service.

Provided that no such alteration shall be made if the age and date of birth of a University employee has been accepted and recorded or deemed to have been accepted and recorded in the service register or book or any other record of service in pursuance of a decree of a civil court obtained by the University employee against the University.

Provided further that no such alteration shall be made without giving the University employee concerned a reasonable opportunity of being heard.

2) No such alteration to the advantage of a University employee shall be made unless he has made an application for the purpose within three years from the date on which his age and date of birth is accepted and recorded in service register or book or any other record of service or within one year from the date of commencement of this statute, whichever is later.

3) The University may appoint such officer or Committee as it deems fit for the purpose of making an enquiry under this statute.

#### Amended Statute-169

All offers of bequests, donations and endowments, the management whereof is to be vested in the University may be accepted on condition that the Annual income therefrom shall be subject to a deduction of 10% thereof, out of which 5% will be added to corpus and the remaining amount so realised by such annual deduction shall be credited to the general fund of the University at the commencement of every financial year.

1. The University shall not accept an endowment for the establishment of Fellowships, Scholarships, Prizes, Gold Medals and other merit awards which are not open to all students of this University in the concerned course/paper at an examination, irrespective of caste, creed, community, religion and region.

2. The University shall not accept an endowment whose corpus is less than Rs. 25,000/- in the case of Scholarships and Rs. 15,000/- in the case of Prizes and Gold Medals and Rs. 35,000/- in the case of Endowments lectures and Rs. 15 lakhs for Institution of a "chair".

3. No endowments will be instituted without being accepted by the Syndicate.

4. Where the amount of interest accruing on the Corpus is not sufficient to obtain a gold Medal manufactured, the University shall have discretion to award of prize in lieu of Gold Medal. However, before awarding such cash prize, the University shall request the Donor or the awardee wherever possible as to whether he/she is willing to donate additional amount to enable the University to supplement the corpus for which Gold Medal is instituted.

5. No Gold Medal shall be accepted for Ph.D. unless it is instituted for a particular specialisation.

"The seniority list of the teachers in the Constituent Colleges (Karnatak Arts/Science/University College of Law/Education/Music) be prepared as per the following rules.

1. The seniority of the Teachers will be prepared taking College as a Unit.

2. The Seniority amongst persons themselves in the same subject of the post or cadre shall be as per the list recommended in the order of preference by the Board of Appointment and approved by the appointing authority as per the provisions of K.S.U. Act. 1976 and has no relevance to the date of their reporting for duty.

### AMENDED STATUTE

3.2.(b): If the employee is appointed in another University with the prior approval of the University in which he was working before such appointment and either the University in which he was previously employed or the employee himself pays the share of contribution relating to him in the Pension Fund or the Contributory Provident Fund.

3.2. (b) (i) and (ii) of 1986 proposed amendment to pension & gratuity statutes-1981 be replaced with the following.



3.2 (b) (i) : Service rendered by teachers of the University in a Govt. Dept./Statutory Body/ Research Institutions under any state or Central Govt. and Universities and Colleges established/ aided by any state or central Govt. be considered for calculating the qualifying service, provided the previous employer or on its failure the Teacher himself pays 1/10 th of the share of the contribution relating to him in the pension and or the contributory provident fund. However, in the case of non-teaching employees of the University service rendered in the Govt. Depts., of Karnataka, Sister Universities in the state & Educational institutions recognised and aided by the State Govt. be considered for calculating the qualifying service provided that the previous employer or on its failure the non teaching employee himself pays 1/10th of the share of the contribution relating to him in the pension and/or the contributory provident fund.

3.2. (b) (ii): However, in respect of service rendered by teachers under Govt. of allocated teachers of one University joining other University in the State, payment of pension contribution is exempted provided the service under Govt./ Univeersity was pensionable.

#### AMENDED STATUTE

" The University shall introduce the Scheme of Merit Promotions for the teachers in the Post-graduate Departments as a sponsored scheme of the University Grants Commission. Promotions shall be made in accordance with the following guidelines :

(a) Teacher in the University Departments engaged in advanced teaching and research and whose contributions and achievements are such as to merit recognition, shall be considered, for merit promotion in the first instance provided they have completed EIGHT years of continuous service in their respective cadre of which at least FOUR YEARS should be in the Karnatak University.

(b) Any teacher who has been considered and not selected for merit promotion in the initial presentation could, however, submit his work again only after a lapse of TWO YEARS.

(c) Teachers interested in such assessment and consideration of merit promotion should present their work to the University through their department, in the proforma prescribed by the University by a date stipulated by the University.



(d) Promotions shall ordinarily be made before the beginning of the next academic year and shall be effective from the date of the beginning of the academic year.

(e) while the final selection of persons to be promoted can be made by the university in accordance with its normal procedure, it would be necessary to refer the work (to include research publications, books reviews, curriculum development, teaching aids, innovation in teaching methods, equipment developed etc) presented by the individual teachers to at least two referees in the subject/discipline concerned, to be selected by the Vice-chancellor out of the members on the board of appointment. The evaluation reports by these referees should be kept confidential and should be made available to the Members of the Board of Appointment. Merit Promotion be given by the appointing authority to a teacher only on the recommendation of the Board of Appointment, duly constituted, after it has given due consideration to the opinion of the referees. there should be at least two outside experts in the case of promotion to Readers and three outside experts in the case of promotion to Professors, on the Board of appointment.

(f) The post of a Reader given to a Lecturer or the position of a Professor given to a Reader through Merit Promotion would be personal to the incumbent concerned.

(g) The main criteria for promotion under the scheme would be the merit of the academic contributions and not the seniority of the teachers."

Statute relating to the election/nomination of representatives of students to the Senate under Section 21(1) (22) of the Karnataka state Universities Act, 1976 (framed as per Section 35 (b) of the Act).

### Definitions

1. Unless the context otherwise requires-

a) "Post-Graduate Student' means a student enrolled for a course leading to Master's Degree or a Post-Graduate Diploma of the University under any of the faculties in a Department of the University or the constituent college or an affiliated college or institution."

b) 'Under-Graduate Student' means a student enrolled for a course leading to first degree under any of the faculties in a constituent college or an affiliated college/institution, but not a student of the Pre-University Courses.

(Note: LL.B., B.Ed., M.B.B.S., B.S.A.M., B.Pharm., B.D.S., B.E., B.Tech., and B.L. and I.Sc. are also the first degrees for the purpose of this clause).

c) 'Representatives of Student' are students who are elected to an electoral college by the Post-Graduate students or Under- Graduate students/nominated by the COD of the P.G.Department or the Principal of the college, Constituent/affiliated, as the case may be, on the basis of performance in matters academic and extra curricular, as decided by the staff council/departmental council as the case may be, and who are eligible to vote at the election to the Senate.

d) 'Elected representative of the student' is one who, after the election by an electoral college is declared to be a member of the Senate.

e) 'Nominated representatives of students' shall mean the students nominated under section 21(1) (22) (b) of the Karnataka State Universities Act, 1976.

f) Election officer shall mean:

(i) in relation to post-graduate Electoral College, the Dean of the Faculty or in his absence such other person from the Post-graduate department as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint; in cases when the Post-graduate faculty has more than one affiliated college the Head of each such college shall be the Election Officer.

(ii) In relation to an under-graduate Electoral College the Head of the affiliated college/institution or his nominee.

### 2. The Returning Officer:

The Registrar, or any other person as may be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor, shall be the Returning Officer and as such he shall be responsible for the conduct of election in respect of election to the Senate from Electoral colleges. The Returning Officer may nominate as many Assistant Returning Officers, Presiding Officers and Polling officers as he deems necessary. The Returning Officer shall issue suitable instructions for smooth conduct of elections.

### 3. Powers of The Vice - Chancellor:

(a) The Vice-Chancellor shall have power to fix the time limit for filing of nominations and withdrawal of nominations and to fix the date of the poll in respect of election to the Senate from the Electoral Colleges.

(b) If, in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor, an emergency has arisen, it shall be competent for him to assume the powers of the Returning Officer and function as such either by himself or by deputing any other person when in the course of election, the Returning Officer cannot carry out his duties.



## CONSTITUTION OF ELECTORAL COLLEGES

## 4. Electoral Colleges:

a) There shall be the following four Electoral Colleges namely,

- i) Post-graduate Electoral College (General)
- ii) Post-graduate Electoral College (Women)
- iii) Under-graduate Electoral College (General)
- iv) Under-graduate Electoral College (Women)

b) The Post-graduate Electoral College (General) shall consist of representatives of Post-graduate Students from each of the Departments at the rate of one representative for every 50 students in the Department and one more for the remaining fraction thereof in the department, provided the fraction is not less than half. If the student strength in any Department is less than 50, there shall be one representative of students.

c) Post-graduate Electoral College (Women) shall consist of representatives of Post-graduate Women students from each of the following Departments at the rate of one representative for every 50 students in the Department and one more for the remaining Fraction thereof in the department, provided the fraction is not less than half. If the students strength in any department is less than 50, there shall be one representative of students.

d) For the purpose of Clauses (b) and (c) the Departments shall be (the following) those which are recognised as P.G. Department of Studies, which are created as per the provisions of Karnataka State Universities Act.

e) The Under-graduate Electoral College (General) shall consist of one representative of students from each constituent or affiliated college for every 500 students and one more for the

remaining fraction thereof, provided the fraction is not less than half. If the strength in a college is less than 500, there shall one representative of student.

(f) The Under-graduate Electoral college (women) shall consist of one representative of women students from each constituent or affiliated college for every 500 women students and one more from the remaining fraction there of, provided the fraction is not less than half. If an affiliated/constituent college has less than 500 women students there shall be one woman representative.

g) The election officer for every Post-graduate Electoral College shall prepare every year lists of bonafide Post-graduate students who are eligible to take part in the election of representative of students to form the Post-graduate electoral college (general) and post graduate electoral College (women) during that academic year, and publish them immediately on the notice boards of the post-graduate Departments/Colleges. Any claim for additions, deletions, corrections shall be made in writing within 2 working days from the date of publication of the list to the concerned Election officers through the heads of the respective Post-graduate Departments/Colleges and all such claims shall be decided by him within 2 working days thereafter and his decision shall be final. Then the final electoral rolls (General and Women) shall be published by the Election officers on the Notice Boards of the concerned Post-graduate Departments /Colleges not later than 31st August of the year.

h) Every Election Officer in the case of Under-graduate electoral colleges shall prepare every year lists of bonafide Under-graduate students who are eligible to take part in the election of representatives of students or to get nominated to form the Under-graduate Electoral college (General) and Under-graduate Electoral



College (Women) during that academic year and publish them on the Notice Boards of the Colleges. Any claim for additions, deletions, corrections shall be made in writing within 2 working days from the date of publication of the list to the concerned Election Officer and all such claims shall be decided by him within 2 working days thereafter and his decision shall be final. Then the Final Electoral Rolls (General and Women) shall be published by the Election Officers on the Notice Boards of the respective colleges not later than 31st August of the year.

i) The Returning Officer with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor shall notify to the students through the Chairman of the respective Departments or other authorised persons of the University in the case of Post-graduate Departments and through the Head of the Colleges in the case of Under-Graduate students, the last date before which the election/nomination of student representatives to the Electoral colleges shall be conducted by them to constitute the four Electoral colleges, and this date shall not be later than 21st September of the year.

Provided, the constitution of the Electoral Colleges shall not be deemed to be invalid by reasons only that the election/nomination of student representatives has not been held/made in any one or more affiliated colleges before 21st September of the year.

j) Election/Nomination to the Electoral College in any affiliated college could be synchronised with election/nomination to the college union of the affiliated college but not later than 21st September of the year.

k) Any dispute relating to the election/nomination to any Electoral college shall be decided by the concerned Election officer and his decision shall be final.

## 5. Methods of Election of Representatives of Students to Constitute the Electoral Colleges:

a) The 'Representatives of Students' who are to represent a Post-graduate Department/Under-graduate College/Institution in an Electoral College shall be elected by the students of the respective Post-graduate Department/College/nominated by the COD/HOD(PG Department)/UG College as the case may be by means of secret ballot held for the purpose/on the basis of his performance in academic and extra curricular activities on the date and at the hours fixed by the concerned Election officer, which shall not be later than 30th August of the year.

b) The voter shall exercise their franchise in person. No vote shall be given by proxy.

c) In all case of election of representatives of students to an Electoral college the candidates shall be nominated in writing in the prescribed proforma and the nomination paper handed over to the Election officer. The nomination paper shall be signed by both the candidates and the proposer. Both candidate and the proposer shall be students from the same Post-graduate Department/Under-graduate college as the case may be. Each nominee shall have to make an election deposit of Rs.25/- which will be refunded if he gets not less than 20% of the total valid votes polled. The election officer shall publish the calendar of events concerning elections from the time of filing of nominations upto the declaration of final results. All the nomination papers shall be scrutinised by the election officer on the date, hour and at the place appointed and notified by him. The candidate or his nominee may be present at the time of scrutiny - As to the validity or otherwise of nomination the decision of the election officer shall be final. The list of the candidates whose nominations have been declared valid shall be published on the Notice Board of the



respective Post-graduate departments/colleges. Any candidate may withdraw his candidature by a notice in writing signed by him and attested by a teacher of the Post-graduate Departments/Collages as the case may be and deliver it in person to the election officer not later than the date fixed for withdrawal. If the number of the valid nominations is equal to or less than the number of representatives to be elected, the Election officer shall declare these candidate elected. If the number of the candidates exceeds the number of representatives to be elected, a poll shall be taken.

d) In the case of single vacancy, a ballot shall be taken in which case voter shall only be entitled to give one vote by placing a cross mark ("X") against the name of the candidate for whom the voter wishes to vote and the candidate receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. In cases of contested election for more than one vacancy, each voter shall be entitled to cast as many votes as there are vacancies to be filled. The candidates who obtain the highest number of votes shall be declared elected, except when by reason of equality of votes the number of such candidates is in excess of the number of vacancies to be filled. In the event of more than one candidate getting equal number of votes, the results shall be declared by the election officer after drawing lots.

e) The Election officer shall be responsible to conduct the election/nomination in the Post-graduate Department/Under-graduate college and announce the result of the ballot in the shortest possible time and communicate the name/s of the "Representatives of the students" to the Returning Officer within 3 days but not later than 8th September of the year. At the time of counting of votes and announcement of the results the candidates shall be permitted to be present.

## 6. Publication of Electoral Rolls of Electoral Colleges:

a) The Returning officer shall publish, before the date fixed by the Vice-Chancellor every year the electoral roll of the Electoral Colleges consisting of the names of representatives of students elected/nominated in the manner indicated in this Statute by the Post-graduate and Under-graduate students of the University.

b) The Electoral rolls shall be valid notwithstanding any vacancies in the representatives of students on the Electoral colleges of any disputes regarding election of any representatives of students.

## CHAPTER - II

## 7. Procedure for Election to the Senate

a) The election of representatives of students to the Senate shall take place at the Head-Quarters of the University on the date fixed by the Vice-Chancellor.

b) For the election of student representatives to the Senate in each year the Returning Officer shall issue a notification for publication on notice boards of all colleges and post-graduate Departments.

c) The Notification shall give the following particulars:

i) The electoral college and the number of seats to be filled by elections;

ii) The date fixed as the last date for receiving nominations the date so fixed being not less than 7 days before the date of the poll;

iii) The date and time before which the nomination may be withdrawn;

iv) The date and time fixed for the scrutiny of nomination papers;

v) The date and hours fixed for the poll and the place of voting.



8. a) Each member of an Electoral college shall be at liberty to nominate one or more candidate from the concerned Electoral college. Every nomination shall be in the prescribed form and shall be seconded by another member of the Electoral college. Every nomination shall be accompanied by a statement signed by the candidate shall make an election deposit of Rs. 50/- which will be refunded if he gets not less than 20% of the total number of valid votes polled at the election.

b) The candidate shall not be a person who has failed to complete a course in six years.

#### **9. Scrutiny of Nomination Papers:**

a) All nomination papers shall be scrutinised by the Returning officer or any other person authorised by him in this behalf on the date and hour and at the place appointed and notified.

b) The candidate or representative of each candidate authorised in writing by him and approved by the Returning officer may be present at the time of scrutiny.

c) As to the validity or otherwise of any nomination, the decision of the Returning officer shall be final.

d) A list of candidates, whose nomination papers have been declared valid, shall be published by affixing the same on the notice board in the office of the Returning officer on the same day and a copy of the same shall be forwarded to each of the candidates nominated for election.

10. Any candidate may withdraw his candidature by a Notice in writing signed by him and attested by the Head of the Post-graduate Department/College and send it by registered post or deliver it in person or through a messenger with an authorised letter to the Returning officer not later than the date and hour fixed for withdrawal.

11. The Returning officer shall publish on the very day after the time for withdrawal of nomination has lapsed, a final list of candidates validly nominated in the office of the Returning Officer.

12. If, after scrutiny, the number of validly nominated candidates is equal to the number or less than the representatives to be elected, the Returning officer shall declare immediately such candidates as having been elected.

If, the number of candidates exceeds the number of representatives to be elected, the election shall proceed in the manner prescribed below:

#### **13. Polling:**

a) The polling shall be held at the office of the Returning Officer at the University Headquarters on the date and between the hours prescribed by him.

b) The poll shall take place by secret ballot in the presence of the Presiding Officer of the polling station.

c) Votes shall be cast personally and not by proxy. Every voter shall produce an identity card bearing his/her recent photograph attested by the concerned Head of the Post-Graduate Department/ College or Under-Graduate College/Institution.

d) The Presiding Officer of the polling station shall enter the name of voter on the counterfoil of the ballot paper obtain the voter's signature on the counterfoil, record his own signature on the ballot paper, and shall then tear out the ballot paper corresponding to that counterfoil, and hand over to the voter. Every ballot paper shall contain the name/s of all the contesting candidates arranged in alphabetical order.

e) When a voter has received a ballot paper, he shall proceed to the place arranged for marking the vote and shall



record his vote by placing a cross mark ("X") against the name/s xxxxxx of candidates for whom he wishes to vote. Each voter shall be entitled to record his votes only to the extent of the number of vacancies to be filled, but he shall not give more than one vote for person.

f) After recording his vote, the voter shall put the paper into a sealed box kept for the purpose in front of the Presiding Officer.

g) All eligible voters present at the polling booth at the time fixed for the close of the poll shall be allowed to vote. After the poll is over, the Presiding Officer shall arrange for sealing the slit of each ballot box. Thereafter the ballot box shall be handed over to the Returning Officer.

h) The Returning officer shall appoint as many tellers as he may consider necessary and shall hand over to them the sealed boxes received from the Presiding Officer for scrutiny, counting of votes and preparing the result sheet.

i) The candidate or representative of each candidate appointed in writing by him and approved by the Returning Officer, may be present at the time of opening of the sealed boxes, scrutiny and counting of votes.

j) The returning Officer shall have the votes counted rejecting as invalid any paper;

i) if it does not bear the signature of the Presiding Officer; or  
ii) if a voter signs his name or writes any word or makes any marks by which it becomes identified; or

iii) if no vote is recorded thereon by placing a cross mark ("X") against the name or names of candidates ; or

iv) if the number of votes recorded thereon exceeds the number of representatives to be elected; or

v) if it is void for uncertainty or if it violates any other law.

k) On every paper so rejected, the Returning Officer shall endorse the word "INVALID" and such papers shall be kept in a separate bundle.

l) The tellers, after preparing the result sheet, shall deliver it to the Returning Officer, who shall declare the results of the election.

14. The candidates equal in number to the number of representatives to be elected, receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared duly elected. When more than one candidates receive an equal number of votes and they cannot all be declared elected, the final result of the election shall be declared by drawing lots in such manner as the Returning Officer may determine.

15. a) As soon as the Returning Officer notifies the results of election, the candidates elected shall be deemed eligible to attend and take part in proceedings of the meeting of senate until the expiry of the term of their membership.

b) Representatives of students elected to the Senate will serve as members of that body for one year, or until the date of next notification to be issued by the Returning Officer calling upon the electorate to elect the representatives a fresh for new term, or at the expiry of the term of the Senate, or when he ceases to be a student of the Post-graduate Department/College or Under-graduate College/Institution which- ever is earlier.

*NOTE:* For the purpose of this provision, a student ceases to be a student as soon as the University declares his/her Examination result.

c) All appeals against the election to the senate from the electoral College shall lie with the Vice-Chancellor whose decision shall be final, provided that no appeal shall be entertained unless it is made within 7 days after the announcement of results.



**16. Dissolution of the Electoral Colleges:**

When the students representatives have been elected to senate, all the Electoral Colleges shall stand dissolved.

**CHAPTER III****17. Nomination of Student Representatives to the Senate**

a) The Head of every Post-graduate Department shall forward to the Registrar by the end of 31st August of each year, the name of an outstanding student of the department, having regard to his/her performance in the qualifying examination for admission to the Post-graduate Course and/or his/her performance in the first year examination of the Post-graduate course.

b) The Head of every constituent/affiliated college having NCC units shall forward to the Registrar not later than 31st August of each year, the name of an outstanding NCC cadet (not being a P.U.C. student) along with his bio-data relating to the NCC performance. From among the names sent by the constituent/affiliated colleges, selection of 6 students shall be made by a Committee of five members consisting of the Group Commander, NCC group Head Quarters, two Principals and two others nominated by the Vice-Chancellor. The Registrar shall be the convener of the committee.

c) The Head of every Constituent/affiliated college shall forward to the Registrar not later than 31st August of each year, the name of the one outstanding sportsman/woman of the college (not being a P.U.C. student) along with his or her bio-data regarding his/her performance in sports/games/athletics. From among the student nominated by the affiliated colleges, selection of students shall be made by a committee consisting of Director of Physical

Education of the University, three principals of the colleges including one principal of a Womens College, and another person nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

d) From among the names received under each of the clause (a), (b) and (c) above, the Vice-Chancellor shall prepare a panel of 3 names under each category and forward them to the state government for further action.

**CHAPTER IV****18. Interpretation of the Statute**

If any question of interpretation of any provision of this Statute arises the decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

5. Nomination papers that are not sent by registered post or not delivered in person or by an authorised messenger and not accompanied by the election deposit of Rs.50/- shall be rejected.

**Statute**

Karnatak University Employees Service (Conduct) Rules under Section 35(m) of KSU Act, 1976

**1. These Statutes may be called Karnatak University Employees Service (conduct) Rules.**

They Shall apply to all persons appointed to the different classes of services and posted in connection with the functions of the University. They shall not however apply to;

a) a member of an All India Service or a State Government Servant on deputation.

**2. Definitions:**

a) "Employee" means any person appointed to any class of post in the University ;

b) "Members of family" includes:

i) the wife or husband of the employee, whether residing with him or not does not but include a wife or husband, separated from the employee by a decree or order of a competent court or by mutual legal agreement;

ii) son or daughter, parents of an employee wholly dependent on him or her.

c) 'Prescribed Authority' means the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor or any other authority as may be specified by the Chancellor in his behalf.

**3) General:**

1. Every employee of the University shall at all times:

- i) Maintain absolute integrity;
- ii) Maintain devotion to duty; and
- iii) Do nothing which is unbecoming of an employee of the University.

2. i) Every employee holding supervisory post shall take all possible steps to ensure the integrity and devotion to duty of all employees for the time being under his control and authority;



ii) Every employee of the University shall in the performance of his official duties, act in his best judgement. When he is acting under the direction of the superior officer, he shall obtain written orders or written confirmation of that officer. However, an employee shall not evade his responsibilities by seeking instructions from his superior officer when such instructions are not necessary in view of the power vested in him.

4) i) No employee/officer shall use his position or influence directly or indirectly to secure any employment, for any member of his family in any private undertaking having dealing with the University.

ii) No employee/officer shall in the discharge of his official duties deal with any matter or give sanction to any contract if any member of his family is interested in such matter or contract, without obtaining the orders of the Syndicate,

#### **5.) Taking Part in politics and Elections:**

No employee of the University shall

i) be a member of or be otherwise associated with, any political party or any organisation which takes part in politics, nor shall he participate directly or indirectly in the activities or deliberations of such parties or organisation.

ii) contest any election to or be a member of the House of State Legislature or of Parliament or any local authority.

**Explanation:** If any question arises whether any deliberation or activity falls within the scope of this rule, decision of the Syndicate shall be final.

#### **(6) Joining of Association by an Employee of the University:**

No employee shall join or continue to be a member of an Association, the objectives or the activities of which are prejudicial to the interest of the sovereignty and integrity of India or public order or morality.

#### **(7) Demonstrations and Strikes:**

No employee of the University shall engage himself or participate in any demonstration which is prejudicial to the interest of the sovereignty and integrity of India, the security of the State, University, friendly relations with foreign States, public order, decency or morality or which involves contempt of court, defamation or incitement to an offence; or resort to illegal strike.

**Explanation:** For the purpose of this statute, 'strike' means cessation of work (including any unauthorised absence from duty) by any of University employees acting in combination or concerted refusal, or a refusal under a common understanding by any number of University employees to work without giving due notice.

#### **(8) Connection with Press or Radio:**

i) No employee shall, except with previous sanction of the Syndicate own wholly or in a part or conduct or participate in the editing or management of any newspaper or other periodical publications.

ii) No employee shall except with previous sanction of the Syndicate or except in the bonafide discharge of his duties.

a) Publish a book himself or through a publisher or contribute an article to a book or a compilation of Articles, or

b) Contribute an article or write a letter to the newspaper or periodical in his own name.

However, no such sanction shall be required.

i) If such publication is through a publisher and is of a purely academic, literary, artistic or scientific character;

ii) If such contribution, broadcast or writing is of a purely literary, artistic or scientific character.



### 9) Criticism of University VIS-A-VIS Government:

No employee shall make any statement in any radio broadcast or in any document published in his own name or in the name of any other person, in any communication to the press or in any public utterance.

i) which is tantamount to an adverse criticism of any current or recent policy or action of the University or Government of Karnataka or Central Government or any other State Government.

ii) which is likely to strain the relations between the University and Government of Karnataka or Central Government or any other State Government.

iii) which is capable of embarrassing the relations between the Central Government and the Government of any foreign country.

### 10) Evidence Before Committee or any other Authority:

1) No employee shall except with the previous sanction of the University give evidence in connection with any inquiry conducted by any committee or authority, unless such committee or authority is appointed by the University or by Central or any State Government.

2) Where a sanction has been accorded by the Syndicate for giving such evidence, the employee shall not criticise the policy or any action of the University or Government of Karnataka or Central Government or any other State Government, unless the evidence is given before the authority appointed by the Government of Karnataka, Central Government or parliament or State Legislature or any judicial inquiry or any departmental enquiry.

### 11) Unauthorised Communication of Information:

No employee shall except in accordance with any general orders of the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor in performance

of the duties assigned to him, shall communicate directly or indirectly any official document or any part thereof or any information to any other employee or any other person to whom it is not intended.

**Explanation:** Quotation by an employee (in his representation to the Vice-Chancellor or the Chancellor) of any letter or circular of office memorandum or from the notes on any file, to which he is not authorised to have access, or which he is not authorised to keep in his personal custody for personal purposes, shall amount to unauthorised communication of the information within the meaning of this Statute.

### 12) Subscription:

No employee shall except with the previous sanction of the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor ask for or accept contributions to or otherwise associate himself with the raising of any funds or other collections in cash or kind in pursuance of any object whatsoever.

### 13) Gifts:

No employee shall accept, or any person acting on his behalf shall accept any gift except as indicated below:

**Explanation:** The term gift shall include free transport, boarding, lodging or other services or any other pecuniary advantage when provided by any person other than a near relative or personal friend having no official dealings with the University. For this purpose a casual meal, lift or other social hospitality shall not be deemed to be a gift. However, he shall avoid acceptance of lavish hospitality or frequent hospitality from any individual having official dealings with his firms.



**(14) Public Demonstration In Honour of University Employees:**

No employee shall except with the previous sanction of the Chancellor/Vice-Chancellor receive any complimentary or valedictory address or accept any testimonial or attend any meeting or entertainments held in his honour or in the honour of any other University employees except in the following cases:

- i) a farewell entertainment of a private and informal character held in his honour or of any other employee on the occasion of his retirement or transfer;
- ii) the acceptance of simple and inexpensive entertainment arranged by public bodies or institutions

No employee shall however exercise any influence to subscribe towards such functions, from employees however private and informal in character they may be.

**15) Private Trade or Employment:**

- 1) No employee shall except with the previous sanction of the Chancellor/Vice-Chancellor engage directly or indirectly in any trade or business or negotiate for or undertake any other employment except honorary work of special, charitable, literary, artistic or of scientific character. In case any such work is undertaken the employee shall report to the Vice-Chancellor/Chancellor within one month, giving full details of such undertaking.

**Explanation:** Canvassing by an employee for a candidate for an elective office or in support of business or insurance agency etc., owned or managed by his wife or any other person of his family shall be deemed to be a violation of the above statute.

- 2) No employee shall without the previous sanction of the Chancellor, except in the discharge of his official duties take part in the registration, promotion or management of any Bank or other company which is required to be registered under the companies

act except in any of Cooperative Societies functioning for the benefit of the employees and is registered under the Cooperative Societies Act, or a literary, Scientific and Charitable Society.

- 3) No employee may accept any fee for any work done by him in any public body without the general or special sanction of the Vice-Chancellor.

**16) Proper Use of Amenities:**

No employee shall misuse or carelessly use the amenities provided for him by the University to facilitate discharge of his duties.

**17) Use of Service without Payment:**

No employee shall without making proper and adequate payment avail himself in any service or entertainment for which a hire, or price or admission fee is charged.

**18) Investment Lending and Borrowing:**

- 1) No employee shall speculate in any stock, share or other investment such as purchase and sale of shares, securities or other investments.

- 2) No employee shall make or permit any person acting on his behalf to make any investment which is likely to embarrass or influence him in the discharge of his official duties.

- 3) No employee shall lend or borrow money as Principal or Agent.

a) To or From any person within the local limits of his authority or with whom he is likely to have official dealings or otherwise place himself under any pecuniary obligation to such person; or

b) Lend money to any person at interest or in a manner whereby return in money or in kind is charged or paid except such transaction pertaining to a relative or a personal friend or a bonafide tradesman, etc.



**19) Insolvency and Habitual Indebtedness:**

An employee shall so manage his private affairs as to avoid habitual indebtedness or insolvency. An employee against whom a legal proceeding is instituted for the recovery of any debt due from him or for adjudging him as an insolvent shall forthwith report the full facts of the legal proceedings to the Chancellor through the Vice-Chancellor unless they are due to unforeseen circumstances.

**20) Movable, Immovable and Valuable Property:**

1) Every employee except C and D class employees shall on his first appointment to any service or post and thereafter at the interval of every 12 months shall submit the returns to the University of his assets and liabilities in a prescribed form giving full particulars of the movable and immovable property inherited or acquired by him irrespective of whether the same are acquired out of salary or from any source other than salary.

2) No employee except with the previous knowledge of the Vice-Chancellor acquire or dispose of any immovable property by lease, mortgage, purchase, sale, gift or otherwise in his own name.

The Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor may at any time by general or special order require an employee to furnish within a specified period a full and complete statement of such movable or immovable property held or acquired by him in his own name or in the name of any member of his family with the sources of income from which such a property is acquired.

**Explanation:**

(i) lease means lease of immovable property from year to year or for any term exceeding one year.

(ii) Movable property includes:

- (a) Jewellery, insurance policies, provident fund, shares, securities and debentures;
- (b) Loans advanced by such employees whether secured or not and
- (c) Motor cars, motor cycles, horses or any other means of conveyance.

**21) Vindication of Acts and Character of the University Employees:**

No employee shall have recourse to any court or to the press for publication of any official act which has been the subject matter of adverse criticism or an attack of defamatory character except any act done by him in the private capacity.

22) No employee shall act without the previous sanction of the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor as a legal guardian of a person or property of a minor other than his wife and children including step children wholly dependent upon him.

**23) Canvassing of Non-Official or other Influence:**

No employee shall bring or attempt to bring any political or other influence to bear upon any University authority to further his interest in respect of matters pertaining to his service under the University.

**24) Personal Representations of Employees:**

Any representation by an employee shall only be made through proper channel whenever addressed to the Chancellor. An advance copy of it may be submitted to the Chancellor in case an employee wishes to do so, under intimation to the University.



**25) Bigamous Marriage and Acceptance of Dowry:**

No employee who has a wife/husband living shall contract any other marriage without obtaining previous permission of the Chancellor unless such marriage is permissible under the provisions of law. No employee shall give or accept any dowry in connection with his own marriage or marriage of any member or his family, i.e. daughters, sons etc.

**26) Consumption of Intoxicating Drinks and Drugs:**

An employee of the University shall.

Strictly abide by any law relating to intoxicating drink or drugs in force in any area in which he may happen to be for the time being.

**27) Interpretation:**

The decision of the Chancellor regarding interpretations of the provisions of these Statutes shall be final.

1. This Statute relating to establishment of "Autonomous College"

comes into force from the date of assent to the Statute by H.E. the Chancellor.

2. An "Autonomous College" means any College designated as an "Autonomous College" by the University.

3. The University confer degrees, titles, diplomas and other academic distinctions on persons who shall have pursued an approved course of study in an autonomous College as an autonomous College with the concurrence of the State Government in the manner and under conditions prescribed and to cancel such designation.

4. The Senate shall prescribe in consultation with the Academic Council the manner in which and the conditions subject



to which a College may be designated as an autonomous College and such designation may be cancelled.

5. The Syndicate may designate any College as an autonomous College with the concurrence of the State Government and to cancel such designation.

6. The Syndicate may propose the draft of any Statute or of amendment to Statute affecting the conditions of affiliation or approval of affiliated or approved College with the University or by the University, as the case may be or affecting of the conditions of designation of any College as an autonomous College after consultation with the Academic Council.

7. The Syndicate may confer the Statutes of autonomy as an affiliated College to conduct specified courses of studies subject to the conditions set forth below:

a) An affiliated Colleges have not less than ten years of starting and accorded permanent affiliation will be eligible for the confirmment of autonomy to conduct specified courses of studies.

b) An autonomous College shall offer instruction only upto Degree, Post-graduate and M.Phil. Courses.

**c) An autonomous College have autonomy in the matter:**

i) Framing syllabus, course contents, adopting the University general patterns. The course contents and pattern should be formed in such a manner so as to avoid the existing staff as surplus for redeployment.

ii) Arranging for instructions to students.

iii) Devising methods of evaluation, examination and facts pertaining to the award of the Degree/Diploma by the University and

iv) Admission to students, in respect of courses of studies for which "autonomy" is conferred.

d) The autonomous college may make rules or byelaws for purpose of screening the objectives for conferring the Statute or autonomy to the College.

e) i) The autonomous College should setup Board of Studies in the subjects concerned and an Academic Council.

ii) The decision of the Academic Council constituted under the preceding Statute on Academic matter shall generally be implemented by the Managing Body of the College on which there shall be a representative of the University.

**iii) The Board of Studies consist of:**

1) Head of the Department of the subject concerned in the College;

2) Head of the Department of the subject in the University or his nominee;

3) All Faculty members of that subject in the College;

4) Not more than 3 Experts from outside the College/ University of the grade of Professors in the subject.

iv) The Governing Council consists a nominee of the University and the Director of Collegiate Education/ Director of Technical Education or his nominee besides two faculty of the College by rotation according to seniority.

v) The University will prescribe qualifications to restrict the number of members under the category with reference to the number of years of service etc.

f) The Board of Studies set up by the autonomous College should consist of external Experts including an Expert from the University.

**g) Functions:**

The Board of Studies of a Department in the College shall-

a) Prepare syllabus for various courses keeping in



view the objectives of the College and the national requirement for consideration and approval of the Academic Council.

- b) Suggest methodologies for innovative teaching and evaluation techniques.
- c) Suggest panel of names to the Academic Council for appointment of Examiners and
- d) To co-ordinate research, teaching extension and other academic activities in the Department/College.

8..1) The Academic Council Constituted by the autonomous College consist of faculties of the College at all levels and a specialist appointed by the University and the decisions taken by the Body will not be subject to any further ratification by the Academic Council of the University or any other statutory bodies.

ii) The Academic Council consisting of:

1. Principal of the College.....
2. All Heads of the Department.                      \* Chairman
3. One Professor from each of the Department by rotation for a period of one year according to Seniority;
4. One Asstt. Professor from each Department, by rotation for a period of one year according to seniority;
5. Three University representatives -One from Science Faculty, one from Arts Faculty, and one from Language Faculty.
6. Director of Collegiate Education/Director of Technical Education or his nominee.
7. The Chairman and the Secretary of the Governing Council in the absence of the Principal, the Principal in-charge will be the Chairman of the A.C.

### iii) Functions of Academic Council

The Academic Council shall have the following powers and functions:

a) Scrutinise and approve the proposals, with or without modification of the Board of Studies with regard to courses of study, the academic regulations, curricula syllabus and modifications thereof, instructional and evaluation arrangements, methods, procedures relevant thereto, etc. provided that where the Academic Council differs on any proposal, it will have a right to return the matter for reconsideration to the Board of Studies concerned or reject it;

b) Make regulations regarding, the admission of students to different programmes of study in the College;

c) Frame regulations for conduct of examinations and initiate measures for improving quality of teaching, students evaluation and student advisory programme in the College;

d) Make regulations for sports, extra curricular activities proper maintenance and functioning of the playgrounds and hostels;

e) Approve candidates for conferment of degree, diploma or certificates by the University.

f) Recommend to the Governing Body proposal for institution on new programmes of study.

g) Recommend to the Governing Body institution of Scholarships, studentships, fellowships, prizes and medals and to frame regulations for the award of the same;

h) Advise the Governing Body on suggestion(s) pertaining to academic affairs made by it; and

i) Perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Governing Body of the Board of Management.

The Secretary shall with the approval of the Principal, convene the meeting of the Academic Council at least once a year and such other occasion as may be necessary. He shall with the approval of the Principal prepare the Agenda for the meet-



ing.

25% of the members shall constitute a quorum. It shall meet once a year.

#### 9. Board of Examiners

Board of Examiners shall be constituted by the Governing Body in consultation with the Academic Council. It shall be responsible for all matters connected with planning and conduct of examinations and evaluation including periodical tests. They shall also have powers to review and finalise examination results and to take disciplinary and remedial measures whenever considered necessary. This body shall analyse the performance of students and reports its findings to Academic Council and Governing Body for their consideration and necessary action.

Board of Examiners may appoint sub-committees to assist in discharging of its functions.

#### 10. Staff Council

There shall be a staff council in the College consisting of all teaching staff and Principal as a Chairman. Staff Council may meet at least once in a year and bring their proposals if any to the notice of the Governing body of the College.

11. Admission of students to course of studies offered by the autonomous College should be the minimum qualifications laid down by the University for the Course of study concerned subject to rules of reservation of candidates belonging to scheduled caste, scheduled tribes and backward classes laid down by the State Government from time to time.

12. The University confer degrees, with diplomas and other academic distinctions on persons who have pursued an approved courses of study in an autonomous college. Further, the Diploma

so issued to candidate should consist name of the College.

13. a) An Affiliated College be conferred the Status of Autonomy for a period not exceeding five years in the first instance subject to revoke of the functioning of the College at the end of three years.

b) The Syndicate may extend the period beyond five years on an application made by the College.

14. The Syndicate may review the autonomy conferred at any time after scrutiny and after giving due notice of such intention to the College concerned before the expiry of the period mentioned in 10 supra in the case of deteriorating standards or for any other good cause.

15. (a) Notwithstanding the conformity of an autonomous Statute on any affiliated Colleges, all Provisions of the Act, the Statute, the Ordinance and the regulations of the University shall be applicable to the College excepting those relating to matter specified in these Statute. The University have a general power of supervision over such a College.

(b) The Advisory Body setup by the University shall monitor the functioning of the College.

(c) The rules and byelaws framed by this autonomous College shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of the KSU Act, 1976.

16. The Syndicate may invite the Colleges to apply for autonomous Status in pursuance of which the Registrar after scrutiny shall place all such application before the Syndicate for consideration and the Syndicate shall decide on the applications according to the criteria specified for the purpose.



17. The College should remit the fee of Rs. 50,000/- along with the application for grant of autonomous Status.

18. The Syndicate may make such enquiry as may be necessary with regard to the applications for autonomy and in consultation with the State Government made its decisions on the basis of such enquiry. The Syndicate shall report to the Academic Council and the Senate on each case of autonomy conferred by it.

Statute governing the acceptance of endowments for award of Gold Medals/Prizes/Scholarships etc.

(Syndicate Res.No. 37 dated 26.8.1993 and Governor Assent on 24.10.1994)

All offers of bequests, donations and endowments, the management whereof is to be vested in the University may be accepted on condition that the Annual income there from shall be subject to a deduction of 10% thereof, out of which 5% will be added to corpus and the remaining amount so realised by such annual deduction shall be credited to the General fund of the University at the commencement of every financial year.

1. The University shall not accept an endowment for the establishment of fellowships, scholarships, prizes, gold medals, and other merit awards which are not open to all students of this University in the concerned course/papers at an examination, irrespective of caste, creed, community, religion and region.

2. The University shall not accept an endowment whose corpus is less than Rs.15,000/- in the case of prizes and Rs.25,000/- in case of Gold medals and scholarships and Rs.50,000/- in case of endowments lectures series and Rs.15 lakhs for institution of a "chair".

3. No endowments will be instituted without being accepted by the Syndicate.

4. Where the amount of interest accruing on the Corpus is not sufficient to obtain a Gold Medal manufactured, the University shall have discretion to award of prize in lieu of Gold Medal. However, before awarding such cash prize, the University shall request the Donor or the awardee wherever possible as to whether he/she is willing to donate additional amount to enable the University to supplement the corpus for which Gold Medal is instituted.

5. No Gold Medal shall be accepted for Ph.D. unless it is instituted for a particular specialisation.

Statute relating to the implimentation of Scheme of revision of UGC pay scales.

#### Coverage:

1. This scheme applies to teachers in all Unversities unless they specifically exercise an option in writing to remain out of this scheme as provided in para 15 hereafter. All teachers after the date from which the Scheme has been given effect will be governed by the provisions of the scheme.

#### Date of Effect:

2. The revised scale of pay will be effective from January, 1, 1986.

#### Pay Scales:

3. The revised scales of pay effective from 1.1.1986 are given in Annexure-1.



4. The revised scales of pay are inclusive of the basic pay, the dearness pay, the dearness allowance, additional dearness allowance and the interim relief, if any admissible to teachers as on 1.1.1986.

5. The scheme of Professors of Eminence is under examination by the Government of India and appropriate decision in this behalf will be taken on receipt of further communication from Government of India.

**Recruitment and Qualifications:**

6. Recruitment to the posts of Lecturers, Readers and Professors in University shall be on the basis of merit through all-India advertisement and selection, provided that Lecturers who fulfill the criteria prescribed in this scheme will be eligible for promotion to the posts of Readers.

7. The minimum qualifications required for appointment to the posts of Lecturers, Readers and Professors will be those prescribed by the U.G.C. from time to time. Generally, the minimum qualifications for appointment to the post of Lecturer in the scale of pay of Rs. 2200-4000 shall be Master's degree in the relevant subject with atleast 55% marks or its equivalent grade and good academic record.

8. Only those candidates, who besides fulfilling the minimum academic qualification prescribed for the post of Lecturer, have qualified in a comprehensive test, to be specially conducted for the purpose, will be eligible for appointment as Lecturers. The detailed Scheme for conducting the test including its design the agencies to be employed in the conduct of tests, content, administration etc., will be prescribed after the guidelines from the U.G.C. are received.

9. In order to encourage research, in continuation of postgraduate studies, candidates who, at the time of their recruit-

ment as Lecturers, possess Ph.D or M.Phil Degree, will be sanctioned three and one advance increments respectively in the scale of Rs. 2200-4000 along with the benefit of corresponding year of service for the purpose of promotion. The existing Lecturers without research degrees and those similarly situate recruited in future will be eligible for a similar benefit in service for the purpose of promotion as and when they acquire research degrees, but will not be eligible for advance increments. Existing Lecturers with research degrees will also be eligible for a similar benefit.

**Career Advancement:**

10. Every Lecturer will be placed in the senior scale of Rs.3000-5000 if he/she has:-

- a) completed 8 years of service after regular appointment, with relaxation as provided in para 9 above;
- b) participated in two refresher course/summer institutes, each of approximately 4 weeks duration or engaged in other appropriate continuing education programmes of comparable quality as may be specified by the UGC;
- c) consistently satisfactory performance appraisal reports.

**Explanation:**

All lecturers in the existing scale of Rs.700-1600 who have completed 8 years of service on 1.1.1986, will be placed through a process of screening/selection as indicated in para 19 below, in the scale of Rs. 3000-5000. The benefit of service provided in para 10 will be available for the initial placement also.

11. Every lecturer in the Senior scale will be eligible for promotion to the post of Reader in the scale of pay of Rs.3700-5700 if he/she has:

- a) completed 8 years of service in the senior scale, pro-



vided that the requirement of 8 years will be relaxed if the total service of the lecturer is not less than 16 years;

b) obtained a Ph.D. Degree, or an equivalent published work;

c) made some mark in the areas of scholarship and research as evidenced by self-assessment, reports of referees, quality of publications, contribution to educational renovation, design of new course and curricula, etc.

d) participated in two refresher courses/ summer institutes each of approximately 4 weeks duration or engaged in other appropriate continuing education programmes of comparable quality as may be specified by the UGC, after placement in the senior scale; and

e) consistently good performance appraisal reports.

12. Promotion to the post of Reader will be through a process of selection by a selection committee to be setup under the Statutes/Ordinances of the University concerned or other similar committees set up by the appointing authorities in accordance with the guidelines to be laid down by the UGC. Post of Readers will be created for this purpose by upgrading a corresponding number of posts of lecturers in the Universities.

13. Those lecturers in the senior scale who do not have Ph.D. degree or equivalent published work and who do not meet the scholarship and research standard of a Reader, but fulfill the other criteria mentioned in para 11, and have a good record in teaching and/or participation in extension activities will be placed in the grade of Rs. 3700-5700 subject to the recommendations of the committee mentioned in para 12 above. They will be designated as Lecturer in Selection Grade posts in the selection grade will be created for this purpose by upgrading the posts held by them. They could offer themselves for a fresh assessment

after obtaining Ph.D. and or fulfilling other requirements for promotion as Reader, and if found suitable, could be given the designation of Reader.

14. Lecturers in the existing Selection Grade of Rs. 1200-1900, if any, will be placed at the appropriate stage in the revised selection Grade of Rs. 3700-5700 in accordance with the pay fixation formula under this scheme, and as already ordered in G.O.No.ED/60/UNI/87 dt. 5.12.1987. Existing Lecturers, who have completed or will complete, a total period of sixteen years of service on 1.1.1986 or thereafter will be eligible for promotion to the post of Reader or placement in the selection grade in accordance with the provisions in para 11,12 and 13 above. They will also be entitled to the relaxation in the years of service by 3 years and 1 year respectively if they hold Ph.D. or M.Phil degrees as mentioned in para 9 above.

15. The existing teachers in Universities where the Merit Promotion Scheme formulated by the U.G.C. in 1983, or any other similar schemes are in operation will have an option to continue to be governed by the provisions of those schemes provided that they exercise that option in writing prior to their pay fixation under this scheme. They will also be entitled to the designations envisaged for various categories of teachers in those schemes, but the scales of pay will be as follows:

i) Lecturer	Rs.2200-4000
ii) Reader/Lecturer (Selection grade)	Rs.3000-5000
iii) Professor	Rs.4500-5700

16. The promotions made before the announcement of the revised scales on 17.6.1987, will not be reopened. However in such cases, the benefit of revision will be available to teachers



only from the date of their promotion.

#### **Continuing Education and Appraisal of Performance:**

17. Participation of teachers at regular intervals in appropriate continuing education programmes is envisaged as an integral part of the professional development of teachers. The University Grants Commission, the Indira Gandhi National Open University, the Universities in the State and other appropriate agencies will be taking steps to introduce programmes of continuing education for this purpose through a variety of means. While there cannot and need not be any rigid requirement of participation in formal programmes, evidence of commitment to continuing education of any recognised means, as may be specified by the U.G.C. will be an essential requirement for career advancement. Pending the organisation of such programmes on the quality and scale required for giving effect to the implementation of the measures envisaged in para 10 to 14 of this Scheme, relaxation from the requirement of participation in such programmes for specific periods and for specific categories of posts, will be granted by the University concerned in accordance with guidelines to be laid down by the U.G.C.

18. Regular and Systematic appraisal of performance of teachers is to be an essential element in the management of education and this has been taken into account in the design for the career development of teachers. The U.G.C. has been requested by the Govt. of India to formulate the guidelines for the evaluation of performance of teachers, taking into account the Statement contained in the National Policy on Education 1986. Such a system should become operational with effect from academic year 1988-89. Till it becomes operational the existing

screening mechanism/selection procedures will apply to all placements/promotions referred to in paras 10 to 14.

19. Necessary statutes/regulations, etc., for giving effect to the Schemes of requirement, career advancement, appraisal of performance and regarding other conditions of service envisaged in this order will have to be framed by the Universities concerned.

#### **Grievance Redressal Mechanism:**

20. Appropriate mechanism for the redressal of teachers grievances will be established in all the Universities in respect of which guidelines will be issued by the U.G.C. separately.

#### **Code of Professional Ethics:**

21. The U.G.C. will prepare a code of Professional Ethics for teachers in consultation with the representatives of national level associations of teachers; all concerned should see to the observance of the Code.

#### **Pay Fixation Formula:**

22. The pay of the teachers in the revised scale on 1.1.1986 will be fixed in accordance with the orders issued in G.O.No.ED 60 UNI 87 dt.5.12.1987. The details of the pay fixation in some cases have been illustrated in the Annexure-2 to G.O.No.ED 60 UNI 87 dt.5.12.1987.

#### **Dearness Allowances and other Benefits:**

23. The Dearness Allowance shall be applicable as ordered in G.O.No.ED 60 UNI 87 dt. 5.12.1987.

#### **Anomalies:**

24. Anomalies, if any, in the implementation of the Scheme may be brought to the notice of the Government for Clarification.

II. In para 5 of the G.O.No. ED 60 UNI 87 dt.5.12.1987 the words 'Senior Scale' may be substituted for the words 'selection scale'.



III. All other matters issued in G.O.No.Ed 60 UNI 87 dt. 5.12.87 and Corrigendum dt. 18.7.1988 which are not inconsistent with the orders issued in this Government Order will continue to apply.

IV. Any other guidelines issued by the Govt. of India/Govt. of Karnataka from time to time.

### I. Title and Commencement:

1. The Statutes shall be called as Karnatak University Teachers (Qualifying the service rendered as Temporary Lec-

2. These Statutes shall come into force with effect from the date of assent of H.E. the chancellor.

### II. Definition:

1. Temporary Lecturer means, a Lecturer appointed by the University on temporary basis in accordance with the provisions of Karnataka State Universities Act, 1976, prior to 5th July 1983 and regularised subsequently prior to 4th July, 1986, but shall not include those in foreign service, those serving in the University on deputation or guest Lecturers.

2. University means 'Karnatak University, Dharwad'.

### III. Applicability:

This Statute shall be applicable to Temporary Lecturers who have been appointed prior to 5th July 1983 and regularised subsequently before 4th July, 1986, under the provisions of Karnataka State Universitis Act, 1976.

This Statute is not applicable to Temporary Lecturers who have been regularised under L.C. Act No.5 (Absorption of Temporary Lecturers Act, 1987).

### IV. Pay fixation, leave, Pension and Seniority:

1. The service rendered by a temporary Lecturer prior to his regular appointment as per the KSU Act, 1976, with or without breaks, excluding the period of break or breaks shall count for the purpose of fixing his initial pay after regular appointment but he shall not be entitled to any arrears of pay or emoluments for the period prior to the date of his regular appointment.

2. The service rendered by such temporary Lecturers, excluding the priod of break or breaks, prior to his regular appointment as per Statutes of recruitment shall not withstanding anything contained in any other law, Statute Ordinance or Rule, be taken into consideration for determining the leave and pension, but for the purpose of Seniority only the service from the date of regular appointment shall be taken into consideratiuon.
